

Finding your bank account and routing number for direct deposit

Your bank account and routing number can be found by looking at **the bottom of your check.**

- **Bank Account #:** This is specific to your checking or savings account and should consist of numbers only. This is typically between 6-18 digits in length
- **Routing #:** This is specific to your bank and should consist of numbers only. This should be exactly 9 digits in length
